Have you ever dreamed of sailing on a Tall Ship? At Sea Sail training can give you the chance to get on board of a Tall Ship and no experience is needed! Together with your teammates from all over Europe, you will be introduced to all aspects of ocean-sailing. A professional crew will teach you everything you need to know about navigating, sailing and manoeuvring. Enjoy working in a team, pushing yourself, making new friends and then partying together at the famous crew parties. There will be adventure and action at sea!

## THE TALL SHIP RACE

The Tall Ship Race 2010 starts in Antwerp! The ships will then go on to Aalborg, where you will get on board to set sail to Kristiansand.

The Cruise in Company from Aalborg (Denmark) to Kristiansand (Norway) will be beautiful sailing along the Scandinavian coast like the Vikings used to do! The trip will go along a lot of islands, with long days and short nights because of the summer season.

## PROGRAMME OUTLINE

> During the Cruise in Company you will meet trainees from all over Europe. Not only on the other Tall Ships, but also as fellow crew on the Morgenster! Your cruise starts at 18.00 hours when you will board Morgenster and get to know the ship, permanent crew and your fellow trainee crew members. After a warm welcome during the Captains introduction and the safety briefing, it is time to have a nice evening on board or in the city. There is always a lot to see and to do in the Tall Ship Regatta Harbour's. In the evening there will be fireworks. Should your travel schedule mean that you arrive before 18.00 hours, you may be able to store your bags aboard and have a look around in town (please check first).

> After a hearty breakfast the next day, the first deck instructions will be given. Together with the crew the ship will be made ready for leaving the harbour. The sails will be set for the Parade of Sail. A lot of people will be on the quay and in little boats to wave to you and wish you luck.

During the Cruise in Company there will not be a start, as it is not a race. But it will be a spectacular view to see all the vessels leaving the harbour, setting sail for the next.

> There might not be any need to sail during the night as the vessels have a lot of time to get from Aalborg to Kristiansand. But if you are going to sail during the night you will be divided into three watches. You will all learn to set the sails, to steer the vessel, to help the cook with the meals and to clean the ship inside and out. You do this during your watch, but also when it is necessary outside of your watch. It is good to work together and take care of the ship. It is a challenge to become part of the crew like a real sailor. Permanent members of the crew will be there to guide you.

> At sea it can be sometimes quite hectic when the wind picks up or slows down, but there is also plenty of time to relax and read a book or sing together during sunset. Relax when possible and be active when it is needed. During the nights you will mostly be in a harbour. There are several harbours who have invited the vessels to stay for the night and organize some activities in the harbour. You will have time to make friends on the other vessels and really explore the surroundings.

> Two days before you leave the vessel, you will set sail for the Kristiansand. The city will be waiting for the vessels to arrive, so prepare for an amazing time in this city.

> In the harbour there will be a lot of activities organized by the town. There will be all kinds of music, sometimes a fair and there will also be a cultural program. There will also be an opportunity to challenge the crew from other ships through sports, walk the crew parade through the whole city, get a prize during the prize giving ceremony (for the sports activities) and last but not least, there is a crew party for everybody in the Tall Ship Race harbour.

> On the 3<sup>rd</sup> day in harbour the voyage will end at 09.00 hour. You will look back on a once in a lifetime experience! For people who want to race or sail again, there are even more possibilities; either on Morgenster (if there is room) or on other ships who are joining the next leg of the races!



## MORGENSTER AND CREW

The ship dates from the year 1919 and the restoration of the ship was finished June 2008. It is restored in authentic manner with square - rigged masts. Beautiful rigging which also allows studding sails, contribute to a truly historical effect. For the enthusiast; you can climb the 30 metres high masts and be part of the races in a spectacular manner.

The Morgenster complies with the latest safety regulations, complying with not only national regulations, but also EU and SOLAS regulations. The same goes for her crew, all have been educated on a nautical college, and done the STCW safety trainings

Owners and Captain Harry and Marian Muter are prepared to take that extra step to achieve a satisfying result during the Tall Ships' Races 2010 and create the right vibe onboard. Besides the Captain and his wife, there will be 2 or 3 extra crew members on the deck.

## ACCOMODATION

You have all the space you need at the Morgenster. On the lower deck you can take a breather at the bar or in the spacious seating area. This vessel can hold up to 36 trainees, divided in four-person and three-person cabins. There are also 8 comfortable hammocks to experience being on a ship to the fullest.
